




Since the last newsletter, we had two very successful "technical dinner meetings".

October 26 we met at Ferris State University. We had a great program hosted by Bob Speirs about the plastics program at FSU and sponsored by Chase Plastics. We also had Dave Chase – Sales Representative, Chase Plastics, Dave Davis-Sales & Marketing Manager, MacLean Fogg, Engineered Plastics Company (both proud FSU grads) and Sassan Tarahomi-Engineering Manager, N.A., IAC share with the students how SPE membership built on their education and helped them integrate that education with successful careers in plastics through further education and networking.

November 9 we were hosted by Linear Mold & Engineering, in Livonia for a tour and presentation.
