PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

But the biggest item we can do to save cost is to have you access the monthly newsletter on-line. Through strong efforts (from Bob Rajkovich, Dean Kroger, Ken Lewis, Erin Porter and others), the website is up and going strong. You can find 2 versions of our newsletter at www.mvspe.org.

By opting for the newsletter not to be sent to you, we save on both printing and mailing costs. This is by far our biggest savings opportunity. You can opt for discontinuing the printed version at the website, or by e-mailing Dean Kroger (djkroger@ashland.com) or myself (fmaus@mincogroup.com). Thanks to everyone who has already taken steps to save this cost.

The Miami Valley Section is still financially strong. Through the hard work of core members (before my time), there is still a very nice nest egg. We need to make sure we do all we can to ensure we have the funds to continue the benefits of SPE.

Treasurer's Report: CD comes due in Dec. and Dick will renew it. It is a 6-month CD that pays 2%. Might just put in \$10,000 instead of \$20,000. One item of note is that quite a few advertisers have dropped out. Therefore, we will not reach \$9000 in advertising like last year. Treasurer's report was approved



It's a word you don't see everyday. Webster's Ninth New Collegiate Dictionary says:
