

The board voted to not give any money. The winter Council meeting was in San Antonio. Dan T attended as a rep of this section. See Dan's report. Jenny Hodge has resigned. National lost \$260,000 dollars last year. An audit will be done by end of the month. The September National meeting will be held in Charlotte, NC.



Golf Outing: Dan has put together the procedure for a successful golf outing. He has some volunteers but needs someone to take over for him. The golf outing will be at Hamilton Elks again. Paul Moore investigated the possibility of having the golf outing at Kings Island (KI). It can be done for the same cost as last year with some exceptions. KI is public not private. Their charge is a flat rate of \$8000. They have a maximum limit of 144 golfers. The price would include carts, driving range and gift shop money. We would have to pay 50% up front. They can't touch the lunch we had last year. In summary, the Elks are the way to go.

One more important piece of information: THE ELKS HAS BANNED STEEL SPIKES. All golfers must be wearing shoes without steel spikes.


