



Minutes Approval: Add Don Keyes to minutes of last meeting, and Dan Tomo.

Advertising/Treasurer's Report: Currently, we are losing 5000 dollars a year. One way to stem the tide of losses can be through the use of the electronic newsletter. We need to find more advertisers to help us stop losing money. At this pace, we will be out of money in four years.

House/Program/Awards/Special Events: The rest of the year is solidified with grand finale tour of Comet Automation.

Education: The education committee met and five One Thousand Dollar scholarships were decided. The April Meeting will include five qualified grant recipients. Each will receive a \$1000 to help support their education. One more important piece of information: THE ELKS HAS BANNED STEEL SPIKES. All golfers must be wearing shoes without steel spikes.


