

ENGINEER WHO DEVELOPED BOMBSIGHTS DIES AT 88

TROTWOOD - William D. Evans, a retired Madison Twp. engineer who developed Air Force life-support gear and a bombsight improvement for the World War II atomic bomb attacks on Japan, died Tuesday in Trotwood. He was 88.

Mr. Evans was known for developing an optical device to enhance the performance of the bombsights used on the U.S. B-29 bombers that dropped atomic bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, resulting in Japan's surrender and the end of World War II.

After the war, he formed a company that designed Air Force life support products, including a "casualty bag" containing survival gear for downed airmen in arctic regions and an automatic parachute opener, his daughter, Carol Sears of Kettering, said Thursday.

Mr. Evans' family nominated him for enshrinement in the National Aviation Hall of Fame for his bombsight work, but Mrs. Sears said documentation of the top-secret project was hard to find.

In a 1996 interview, Mr. Evans said the secrecy kept him from learning about his own role in the world's first nuclear bombings until two years later. "At the time I was working on this, I didn't even know there was any such thing as an atomic bomb."

Mr. Evans was born July 20, 1915 in East Liverpool. He grew up in Chillicothe and Columbus and received a bachelor's degree in engineering physics from the Ohio State University in 1936.

He worked on military projects during the war and carried out his top-secret bombsight work in his garage in Oakwood.

He lived in Madison Twp. until 2002, when he moved to the Shiloh Springs Care Center in Trotwood.

Mr. Evans is survived by his wife Helen; two sons, David Evans of Columbus and Larry Evans of Dayton; daughter, Carol Sears of Kettering; two grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.



COUNCIL SUMMARY

TO: THE COUNCIL

This summary is intended to help you review the highlights of the Council Meeting held in New Orleans, Louisiana on January 31, 2004.

The main Council action was the election of the 2004-2005 Officers.

Elections:

President-elect: Len Czuba, Czuba Enterprises Senior Vice President: Nancy I. Hermanson, Dow Chemical Vice President / Divisions: Paul G. Andersen, Coperion Corporation

Ms. Karen L. Winkler, the 2003-2004 President-elect, will become SPE President at the 2004 Annual Technica1 Conference meeting in Chicago, Illinois when the newly elected officers are installed.

Mr. Russell C. Broome, Piedmont Coastal Councilor, was elected as Chairperson of the Council Committee of the Whole.

Council Action: Council approved the following:

1) Rebate Payments for 2004 & 2005:

The Council voted to suspend rebate payments for Sections and Divisions in 2004 and 2005 except in cases of demonstrated hardship. All Section/Division Presidents, Chairs, Treasurers and Councilors were sent a letter on Monday, February 2 explaining that rebates will not be paid this year unless funds are absolutely needed by individual Sections or Divisions.

This decision was reached after long and lively debate. The motion carried by a solid majority. The decision recognizes the difficult financial position of the Society at this time, and the unfortunate need to rein in spending at all levels of the organization in order to bolster cash flow and make a material contribution to retained earnings. Society leadership heard "loud and clear" the call to do things differently throughout all parts of the organization.

2) Student Chanter:

Council approved the formation of a Student Chapter at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New York

Other Business

The Council agenda included reports from SPE's officers and staff on programs and activities in all areas of the organization. President Donna Davis delivered a report on the overall state of the industry. Deputy Executive Director Susan Oderwald reported on the Society's progress with "Leadership for Excellence." Ms. Oderwald also gave Council an update on staff activities and a preliminary financial report on Year End for 2003. The Flexible Packaging SIG has now become a Division in Formation.

Contributions

The following donations were presented:

- 1) Tom Sloss of the Connecticut Section presented a check to the Foundation in the amount of \$1,000.
- 2) Jim Griffing of the Composites Division presented a check for the Harold Giles Scholarship Fund in the amount of \$1,000. He also made a presentation of \$4632.30 which was SPE's share of the proceeds of the Composites Divisions half of last Septembers Automotive Composites Conference.

The next formal Council meeting is scheduled for Sunday, May 16, 2004 in Chicago, Illinois.




