Building thirteen was again the home of the Miami Valley SPE tabletops display of auto parts, drawer fronts, performs and toys. The highlights of the years of doing these, is the repeat of customers that say "all of my friends are so jealous of my backscratcher, may I have one more to take to them?" With the help of good MVSPE member companies as Marco Molding and Recto Molding, we again had enough shoehorns, backscratchers performs and dinosaurs for all. (We have run out several years in a row)

The interaction with the children first "would you like to see how these dinosaurs are made?" and then ask the parent "to get one of these prized objects (shoehorn or backscratcher) "are all plastics recyclable?"

If the parent answers "no" we "ask the other more intelligent one" (even the child) again, and then explain that "because your trash hauler only takes $\dots(1,2,5)$ it does not mean that all plastics are not recyclable. It is a long two days (like working a trade show with people asking you question you take for granted they should know) and always good to see the good we can do one on one with the public. They ask hard question, and we try to give good answers, or refer them to the website 4spe.org.

COUNCILOR'S MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Charleston, SC January 26 and 27, 2007

Attendee from MVSPE: Dennis Richmond -Next Council Meeting at ANTEC in Cincinnati, OH, May 4 and 5, 2007 -September 2007 Council Meeting scheduled in Irvine, CA Attendance at Charleston's Council session: 141 possible, 81 present; 72 sections + 9 divisions

-REBATES: Requirements being considered are sections will need to attend 2 of 4 Council Meetings, versus the 3 of 4 guidelines.

There now is an issue with the merging of sections with regards to who receives the rebates and how much.

The vote on should the rebate policy be revised will be taken at ANTEC; majority of the Councilors posted their vote to do nothing at present.

-COMMUNICATIONS: Place Tricia McKnight, at SPE National on the MVSPE mailing lists, so she has easy record of the Sections communications with our members.

-STAR REPORT: This report is due February 28, 2007.

-PLASTICS ENGINEERING MAGAZINE: The content of the PE magazine is becoming more technical with focus on solutions for the end users. There is also a focus to improve the advertisement. PE is the only magazine internationally. The European version is now combined with PE.

-EDUCATION: The Committee for Education is fervid about the sections and student chapters submitting their applications for the Husky and Chase awards respectively. In 2006 a total of nine (9) sections applied for the Husky award. Only four (4) student chapters submitted applications for the Chase award. The Husky Award is for \$5,000 and the Chase Plastics Award is a total of \$2,500.

-SPE FINANCIALS: The Society overall was \$20,000 in the black for 2006. This was accomplished with membership, ANTEC attendees, and PE advertisers all being lower than 2005. Leasing of the 1st floor space at SPE headquarters has helped offset costs.

-ANTEC: This event in Cincinnati is developing into one of the largest ANTEC's in recent history. One key point is the partnership with Plastic's Encounter. \$420,000, 17,000 sq. ft. of exhibition space has been sold to date. This is the best ever with the most in the past being \$275,000 and 12,000 sq. ft. There are already 130 exhibitors and more technical papers than time to present them all.

Final Note: Tricia McKnight at SPE National, who has been the sections' liaison, is acquiring more responsibilities which is great for her, but she maybe a little less available to the sections. Although with her additional responsibilities she is available to travel and to meet directly with the sections' boards
