Speaker Biography

Dr. Eric J. Amis

Department of Polymer Science, The University of Akron


Eric J. Amis is Dean of the College of Polymer Science and Polymer Engineering, and Professor of Polymer Science. Concurrent with his role as dean, Dr. Amis also served as Vice Provost for Research for 18 months and Interim Dean of the College of Engineering for five months. He has a special interest in research engagement with industry.



Dr. Amis came to UA in 2014 from United Technologies Research Center, where he was Director of Physical Sciences since 2009. He led a team of 140 scientists and engineers responsible for research and development in advanced manufacturing, materials and chemical sciences, structural integrity, applied physics, and measurement science. In addition, he was responsible for developing external partnerships aligned with UTC strategies in advanced manufacturing.

Prior to UTRC, Amis spent 15 years in leadership roles at the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) for the Materials Science and Engineering Laboratory, including 10 years in the Polymers Division. Before NIST, he was on the faculty in chemistry at the University of Southern California for 11 years. His Ph.D. in chemistry is from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and B.S. from Willamette University.

Dr. Amis is a member of the Connecticut Academy of Science and Engineering and a Fellow of the American Chemical Society, the Materials Research Society, the American Physical Society, and the Polymeric Materials Science and Engineering Division of the American Chemical Society. He has served as chair of the Division of Polymer Physics of the APS and of the Polymer Chemistry Division of the ACS, and he was Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Polymer Science: Physics for 11 years. His research interests are combinatorial and high-throughput methods for functional polymers or biomaterials, direct write and additive manufacturing, nanomaterial characterization, gels and networks, polyelectrolytes, and soft matter physics. He has 150 peer-reviewed publications and 58 H-index.

The Akron Section SPE has again earned the Pinnacle Gold Award (highest level of award) from SPE Int'l for 2018. The SPE Pinnacle Award recognizes Sections and Divisions that work to create and deliver member value in four categories of achievement organization, technical programming, membership and communication.

- Organization Maintaining compliance with Section/Division organizational guidelines and policies.
- Technical Programming Providing quality technical programming to members.
- Membership Developing and implementing plans that result in annual membership growth.
- Communication Communicating effectively with members about SPE offerings and events to foster a sense of community and allow members to respond.

The award will be presented to the section at the ANTEC in May.

In addition, the Akron Section has again been recognized as a Communications Leader in the 2018 SPE Communications Excellence Award. This is the most prestigious level of the award. It recognizes a full range of achievements in communication excellence. The purpose of the award is to recognize Sections, Divisions and Special Interest Groups (SIGs) that carry out highly effective communications with their groups and, optionally, with other parts of the Society during the course of the SPE year. It is intended to recognize all types and forms of communications as opposed to being focused on one medium or method of communication and information delivery. It is not a competitive award. Rather, it is based on meeting or exceeding certain performance standards and accomplishment thresholds.

Like the Pinnacle Award, it will be presented to the section at the ANTEC in May.

SPE Council Meeting Friday, March 9, 2018 Remote Teleconference

Council Summary

The March Council meeting provided the forum for the "Meet the Candidates" portion of SPE Executive Board elections. The following candidates were presented to Council:

VP Divisions: Jason Lyons & Scott Steele

VP Sections: Monika Verheij & Scott Eastman

VP Technology & Education: Raj Krishnaswamy & Ray Pearson

President-Elect: Brian Landes

The candidates were offered time to present themselves to a live audience. Questions were prepared in advance and posed to the candidates from various councilors. Extended discussions continued on The Chain. The elections are scheduled for March 19 and 26.

Financial Report

The Finance Committee is scheduled to present the 2018 budget to the EB during the week of 3/14. New expense items include IT upgrades, staff hires and branding improvements. New revenue items include membership dues, non-dues revenues from a new Multiview newsletter campaign, and corporate sponsorships. Chief Staff Executive Farrey continues to focus on cost control while issuing conservative forward-looking guidance, including in the area of investment returns. Farrey added that SPE is now using a new accounting format and associated software.

Strategic Commentary

CSE Farrey provided commentary on three distinct areas: ANTEC, Technology, and Staffing. 2018 is a challenging year for ANTEC given unique circumstances associated with co-locating with PLASTICS at NPE. Due to space constraints, SPE cannot accommodate all papers. A discount for ANTEC will be offered to chapter board members via early registration. The Plastics Race (TPR) will not be held due to co-location challenges.

An exciting new technology platform for all SPE will be launched officially at ANTEC. The new platform will completely overhaul the membership experience and provide an opportunity to upgrade the SPE logo and brand. A phased approach will allow affiliate groups the chance to adopt the new look & feel for their own websites with full support from HQ.

Several new hires and promotions at SPE (including the Foundation) will result in better alignment between resources and organizational needs.

Executive Board reports

In keeping with the 3-Year Operating Plan that created the functional roles for EB Vice Presidents, several board members provided insight into their discrete areas of focus. The Sections Committee successfully reinstated the Ohio Valley Section (formerly Miami Valley). The VP of Divisions, Jason Lyons, completed a Best Practices document for all volunteer leaders to share. Lyons, in conjunction with the VP of Marketing & Communications, will continue to host Town Hall-type discussions to solicit feedback from members

and councilors. In Technology & Education, VP Brian Landes announced a new partnership with Virginia Tech on Additive Manufacturing coursework. VT will provide course content, instructors and facilities; SPE will provide event promotion and planning, marketing and technical content review. With ANTEC on the horizon, VP of Events, Jaime Gomez, reported that the financial model for the new ANTEC experience will be presented to the EB at the next board meeting, March 14-15. Gomez recommends a Town Hall-type review to present and discuss the new proposals.

The official SPE meeting minutes are posted to The Chain in Leadership Lane. The next EB/FC in-person meeting will be with Council on May 6 in Orlando, FL.




